PERSONAL SUMMARY

I am currently employed as a General Surgeon with an interest in Hepatobiliary, Upper Gastrointestinal and General Surgery at Raigmore Hospital, Inverness, having taken up post April 2005. My qualifications are MD FRCS Ed. I was awarded a Masters in Medical Law (MML) from the University of Glasgow in April 2015. I achieved the status of a Certified Civil Mediator after studying with the London School of Mediation in 2018.

I undertook Specialist Registrar training in General Surgery in the Manchester region between 1996 and 2001. I completed my M.D. in Imperial Cancer Research Fund's Genetic Epidemiology Laboratory in Leeds. I then undertook subspecialty training in hepatobiliary surgery in Manchester and London between 2001 and 2005.

I was appointed as a general surgeon with a hepatobiliary and oesophago-gastric interest to Raigmore Hospital in April 2005. I re-established the pancreatico-biliary and oesophago-gastric cancer resection service in NHS Highland after an extended period of dormancy, during which all patients considered for resection were referred to neighbouring centres. I established the liver resection service in NHS Highland. I have overseen a developing HPB / OG team that now comprises 4 consultant surgeons.

Consequently my practice reflects the breadth of hepato-pancreatico-biliary and oesophago-gastric disease including onward referral for complex cases, as well as encompassing the generality of surgery. The latter includes active participation in the general surgical receiving rota, with ongoing responsibility for the full spectrum of emergency surgical disease, with the exception of vascular and complex urological patients. Acute biliary disease is a major component of acute surgical practice, and I am involved in the management of patients with gallstone disease on a frequent basis.

My general surgical interests include laparoscopic surgery, the management of abdominal wall herniae, general surgery of childhood, therapeutic endoscopy and ERCP. I am a member of the HPB and OG MDT.

I was Training Programme Director for Surgical Trainees on the North of Scotland Surgical Training Scheme from 2014 - 2023. I am now Chair of the Surgical Training Committee. I was Clinical Director for the Surgery and Anaesthetics Division in Raigmore Hospital between 2012 and 2020.
