Surgical Experience

I have a one-year-experience in experimental microvascular surgery. I am able to use operating microscope in human practice if necessary.

30 years of clinical surgical experience: 7 years in general surgery, 24 years in Vascular Surgery (with overlap). Two years as Head of Department in an Academic Vascular Surgical Unit.

I am confident in dealing with most of the elective and emergency vascular surgical procedures, including aortic aneurysms, aorto-iliac reconstructions, femoro-popliteal and femoro-distal bypass operations, vascular access procedures for dialysis and carotid endarterectomies.

Teaching experience

I have a six-year undergraduate teaching experience in General and Vascular Surgery at the University Medical School of Debrecen, Hungary, including formal lectures and ward teaching (in Hungarian and English, in two Curricula) plus four years of postgradute teaching in General and Vascular Surgery in both languages (pre-1996). Four years of undergraduate teaching in Vascular Surgery at the Department of Vascular Surgery, Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh. One year of undergraduate teaching at the Department of Vascular Surgery, Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge. One year of undergraduate training at the Department of Vascular Surgery, Heartlands Hospital, Birmingham. I also participated in postgraduate (SHO and Registrar) training in Edinburgh and Cambridge. Twenty-one months of under- and postgraduate teaching at the University Department of Vascular Surgery, DEOEC, University of Debrecen — I was responsible for the Vascular Curriculum there. I was a tutor/supervisor in the Basic Surgical Skills Course in Heartlands Hospital, Birmingham and the Royal Stoke University Hospital, UHNM, Stoke-on-Trent.

I have been actively involved in under- and postgraduate teaching in the Royal Stoke University Hospital, UHNM, Stoke-on-Trent and at the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board, North Wales. Lecturing includes all fields of Vascular Surgery and Vascular Access. Currently I am the Educational Lead for Vascular Surgery in North Wales.

I was part (and head) of the team of 5 Consultants, based in a 25-bed Vascular Unit.

I had financial responsibilities regarding the budget of the Vascular Unit. This required close interaction between Clinicians and the Hospital Leadership.

(I left this post as the Hospital Management was not prepared to provide the funds sufficient to run a tertiary referral centre academic vascular unit, despite these had been discussed and agreed on before I took up my position.)

Currently I am the Deputy Clinical Director for Vascular Surgery within the Centralized Vascular Services.

I have been a member of the UEMS - European Board of Vascular Surgical Qualifications (EBSQ-Vasc) since 2004. This has been renamed as FEBVS Examination now. I have been examining for the FEBVS Examination Board since 2004, initially yearly, now twice a year since 2014.

Having applied as Associate Professor and Head of Department at the University Department of Vascular Surgery, Debrecen, Hungary, I secured the European Society for Vascular Surgery Annual Meeting for Hungary for 2013.

Supporting information – achievements in my career

Before I pursued a career in Vascular Surgery I was engaged in looking after **oncology** (particularly breast cancer) patients. **I was** one of the founding members and **Chief Operating Officer** of the **East Hungarian Breast Cancer Foundation** between 1992 and 1996. In retrospect this was one of the most rewarding times in my career.

I have done **clinical research** in Vascular Surgery, and my PhD thesis was based on this research. (The thesis was supervised by Professor AW Bradbury, currently Professor of Vascular Surgery at the University of Birmingham). I am able to set up and run a research project and supervise Junior Doctors aiming for an MD thesis. I used to be in the Steering Committee of the BASIL (Bypass versus Angioplasty for Severe Ischaemia of the Limb) Trial in 1999-2000 with Professor Bradbury.

I have very good contacts in several leading European and overseas institutions (Denmark, Sweden, Spain, Holland, USA, Australia). I am keen to visit Academic centres, and in 2004 I spent some time at Yale University, New Haven, CT, USA, as Visiting Professor. This particular Visiting Professorship was dedicated to Vascular Services on diabetic patients. I have an extensive experience in dealing with diabetic patients, and I was looking at diabetic foot services under the leadership of Professor Sumpio and Dr. Bloome at Yale University.

I am very keen on teaching, and beside my teaching experience detailed in one of the previous chapters, I am a member of the Examining Committee for the European Board of Vascular Surgery (FEBVS - previously EBSQ-Vasc) Examination, which requires my regular attendance every year there since 2004.

Perhaps the finest achievements in my career so far are the securing of the 2013 ESVS (European Society for Vascular Surgery) Annual Meeting for Budapest, Hungary and being a Visiting Professor at Yale University in 2004. I applied for the ESVS Annual Meeting back in 2006 as Head of Department of Vascular Surgery, DEOEC, University of Debrecen, and following a presentation I won the rights in 2007 to organize the meeting for 2013, beating the application of Professor Jesper Swedenborg (then past-President of the ESVS) for Stockholm, Sweden and Professor Jan Brunkwall (then President of the ESVS) for Cologne, Germany.

My visit to Yale University as a Visiting Professor came as a result of the invitation from Professor Bauer Sumpio, Head of Vascular Surgery and Interventional Radiology at Yale University.
