AIMS and EXPERIENCE

I have worked as a substantive Consultant Obstetrician and Gynaecologist in both the UK and Australia over 30 years and currently as a NHS and Agency Locum Consultant. My wish is to continue working clinically using the skills, experience, courses and certificates I have including in the area of Quality and Safety as per the GMC's Appraisal/Revalidation process. I have revalidated until 2022 and am up to date with my RCOG/CPD. My experience extends to having worked, including as part of my training, in some 51 Trusts or hospitals on 2 continents.

I have undertaken TMA assessed OU and ILM courses in leadership, management and project management as well as law, clinical risk management, root cause analysis and am certified as an Expert Witness through the Cardiff University Bond Solon Expert Witness Certificate Course. I have an interest in medico-legal matters with special interests in consent and risk and change management. I have also attended courses in education and teaching and more recently for appraiser training.

I have been a consultant for over 30 years and an accredited specialist for 32 years. I have worked in the NHS as generalist, consultant with a 'special interest' (in colposcopy, oncology and uro-gynaecology) and as a sub-specialist in University Tertiary Referral Centres, including as Lead Consultant, and in District General Hospitals for the past 20 years. I have trained and supervised RCOG and RANZCOG specialist trainees and university medical students in two continents and have worked as a college training assessor in colposcopy and practiced team obstetrics whilst maintaining a largely independent and special interest skills in gynaecology.

I was appointed to my Australian post, in 2010, as a change management strategy after the department had lost its Integrated Training Programme accreditation. My work, as a part of the team to regain accreditation, involved clinical (hands-on) work in our delivery suite (including teaching rotational forceps and vaginal breech), antenatal clinics and specialist obstetric clinics and caesarean section lists (teaching and training) and in gynaecology clinics, gynaecological operating lists (minimal access and open cases) and specialist uro-gynaecology and colposcopy clinics, including the use of laser and LLETZ. I acted as supervisor and mentor to a number of trainees from Australia and overseas and helped with their audit projects. Accreditation was restored in 2012.

I am used to working in teams with daily labour ward meetings, oncology, colposcopy and urogynaecology MDTs and carrying out teaching and training ward rounds.

Multidisciplinary work in obstetrics/paediatrics, oncology and urogynaecology has always been a part of my practice. I have produced and updated clinical guidelines, carried out audits and supervised trainees in theirs. I attend education and multidisciplinary meetings.

Operatively I carry out a full range of procedures including cervical LLETZ and cervical and vulval Laser, Hysteroscopic and Laparoscopic surgery including ablative techniques, oophorectomy, ovarian cystectomy, tubal excision, endometriosis excision and ablation, hysterectomy, division of septae and myomectomy. I have been carrying out hysterectomy as an open procedure and vaginally for DUB and laparotomy for large fibroids and ovarian masses. I have also taught TVT, bulking procedures, Botox to the bladder, vaginal prolapse surgery, colposuspension and other continence surgery and abdominal sacrocolpopexy.

Prior to working in Australia, I had initially practised as a consultant in general obstetric and gynaecological practice with special interests in colposcopy, oncology and urogynaecology having received advanced training in pelvic floor surgery, uro-gynaecology, minimal access techniques and ultrasound and clinical sub-specialty training in the treatment of gynaecological pre-malignant and malignant disease. After working in Australia, in 2015 I worked for six months to 're-acclimatise' myself as SR working on Delivery Suite, ANC, Wards and Assessment Clinics and CS lists as well as Emergency Gynaecology, GOPD, Colposcopy and Operating Theatres (day case and complex in patient surgery) and MDTs. Since then I have worked as a Consultant in a variety of roles.

I have utilised these special skills at consultant level in all my posts, working in rapid access and colposcopy clinics, urodynamic clinics, early pregnancy clinics, fertility control clinics, gynaecological ultrasound and ambulatory clinics and complex pelvic surgery and continue to utilise whatever skills I possess as may be useful to any post to which I am appointed in order to support colleagues. During 2018 I commenced work as a PLAB2 Examiner for the GMC and currently I have also worked temporarily as a Functional Assessor for the DWP through CHDA as a break from O&G.

Special Interest and Clinical Training Experience

COLPOSCOPY

I have worked in colposcopy and vulvoscopy since 1982 having been trained by two of the founders of the BSCCP, Albert Singer and Malcolm Anderson. My interest in colposcopy of the female genital tract developed as an SHO at The Samaritan Hospital for Women/St Mary's Hospital (London). I am a member of BSCCP and ASCCP and audit my practice. I am competent in the use of laser, LLETZ, cold coagulators and cryo-therapy. I carried out colposcopy for the original NHS Clinical Study of HPV and Liquid Based Cytology. I worked with the London QA and Imperial College as a lead colposcopist to turn around the local colposcopy unit in Ealing for which my work was highly commended. I worked to improve local audit and chaired MDTs. I attend cyto-pathology meetings and help to train juniors and nurse practitioners in the skill. I have been a training colposcopist and RANZCOG assessor in Australia and am BSCCP certified to 2021.

ONCOLOGY

After obtaining my FRCS and general accreditation, I received training in the surgery of gynaecological malignancy and the medical and radio-therapeutic management of these patients in a multi-disciplinary setting at St Bartholomew's and The Royal Marsden. I obtained my FRCS in general surgery with 24 months spent in urology, gastrointestinal work (including dealing with malignancy) and breast cancer and then returned to obstetrics and gynaecology. I took my FRCS in order to become skilled in surgical techniques and principals. I have continued to use these surgical skills in the treatment of malign and benign gynaecology and in complex obstetric emergency situations.

My specific training in oncology was as Senior Registrar in Gynaecological Oncology 1987-88 (18 months) at The Royal Marsden Hospital and St. Bartholomew's Hospital Hospitals with Professor John Shepherd and Professor Chris Hudson. In May 1989 I was presented as the Senior Registrar in Gynaecological Oncology to the RCOG at the successful Accreditation Visit of my training programme. This had followed my basic training in obstetrics & gynaecology for my MRCOG and for accreditation; as well as work towards my FRCS which included work as a surgical SHO at The Royal Marsden Hospital in urology and gynaecological oncology (7 months) in 1978. My surgical training involved 3 years working successively in an emergency department, orthopaedics, urology, vascular, breast and gastrointestinal surgery.

My gynaecological practice has also involved attending and participating in rapid access (2WW), multi-disciplinary clinics and MDT meetings. I have recruited patients into clinical trials and audited work. I carried out the FIGO audit of gynaecological cancer at the Royal Marsden Hospital for the time I was there. I am considered an effective team leader by those I have worked alongside, chaired MDT meetings and consider myself able to motivate others and adapt to changing demands working to cancer plans to achieve the relevant standards required within a cancer network.

URO-GYNAECOLOGY

I originally gained experience in uro-dynamics at King's College Hospital with Professor Linda Cardozo and Professor Eboo Versi and later helped to set up and run the gynaecological uro-dynamic service at St. Bartholomew's Hospital with Professor Chris Hudson.

From 1989, as a consultant, utilising my knowledge of oncology practice I introduced the concept of a local multi-disciplinary uro-gynaecology service with joint clinics between the community continence advisor and myself and developed close links with the gynaecology physiotherapists who ran clinics for pelvic floor exercises and stimulation. I trained a senior sister to perform uro-dynamic studies and audited our work and designed patient orientated leaflets about the service, later I practiced as lead clinician in the tertiary setting of St James' Hospital in Leeds.

In order to increase efficiency and reduce waiting times I streamlined our service, triaging patients to our continence advisor and physiotherapists with cross referral as required prior to consultant clinic appointments. This is now expected within NICE Guidelines. It proved both cost-effective and improved patient satisfaction. The continence advisor attended all consultant clinics tas an early form of multidisciplinary clinics and team work. This led in 1997 to us setting up a joint pelvic floor clinic with a colorectal colleague. Patients with intractable detrusor problems, contracted bladders or primary bladder disease were discussed with urological colleagues though today Botox is offered. We also often referred to neurology colleagues though there was again no formal joint clinic. Each year we saw patients with a history of abuse who benefited from the clinics being jointly run with female personnel.

The surgery I am able to offer includes vaginal surgery under both local and general anaesthetic as day case and in-patients. Instead of mesh I have always favoured native tissue repair but also offer porcine implant repairs, sacrospinous fixation, sacrocolpopexy, colposuspension and slings (I am able to offer TVT to suitably informed and consented patients.

I try to keep drug treatment to a minimum by early use of PFE and Bladder retraining but use both Botox and Bladder-neck Bulking agents.

MINIMAL ACCESS SURGERY

I have undertaken hands-on animal and laboratory training courses in Guildford, at the RCOG, and through The Royal London Hospital at Elancourt Laboratories near Paris with Professor Chris Sutton and Adrian Lower. This has included diagnostic and therapeutic aspects of hysteroscopy and laparoscopy in in-patient and out-patient settings and I continue to update and utilise the technique. I am able to carry out not only diagnostic hysteroscopy and laparoscopy, but a variety of endometrial ablation techniques, excision of uterine septa, hysteroscopic and laparoscopic myomectomy and laparoscopic treatment of endometriosis, ectopic pregnancy, ovarian cystectomy and oophorectomy. I am able to perform laparoscopic pelvic lymphadenectomy, laparoscopic hysterectomy. I am proficient with plasma kinetic, bipolar, tripolar and harmonic scalpel instruments.

ULTRASOUND

I originally received training at King's College Hospital, London, with Professors Stewart Campbell and Kypros Nicholaides, in obstetric scanning and later received training in

gynaecological and ovarian scanning, abdominally and with vaginal probes both there and at St. Bartholomew's Hospital. This allowed me subsequently to run early pregnancy services, post-menopausal bleed clinics, rapid access and one-stop clinics where I have provided assessment with colposcopy, ultrasound and hysteroscopy. I continue to carry out basic gynaecological and obstetric ultrasound in various settings to aid my clinical practice..

REPRODUCTIVE MEDICINE

I have, both during my training and since, provided clinics in reproductive medicine with special reference to the medical treatment of dysfunctional uterine bleeding, hirsutes, PMS, menopause and sub-fertility work. This latter included work on ovarian stimulation but not IVF. Male sub-fertility was passed on to urological colleagues and IVF carried out at regional centres.

OBSTETRICS

Continuing as a hands-on clinician with my trainees, I have experience of obstetric care in both ward and clinic settings including tertiary referral in UK and Australia; including ultrasound, Doppler blood flow, amniocentesis, labour ward management and antenatal and early pregnancy clinics. I continue to carry out antenatal clinics and a number of labour ward sessions each week, teaching students and directly supervising juniors, including at caesarean section. I carry out antenatal and post natal ward rounds. I work closely with midwives and midwife teachers

I am able to manage preterm pregnancy, diabetic pregnancy, multiple pregnancy, breech delivery, patients with haemoglobinopathies, cervical cerclage, fetal blood sampling, ventouse, forceps deliveries and caesarean section. I have a great deal of experience in dealing with obstetric emergencies such as antepartum and post partum haemorrhage, pre-eclampsia/eclampsia, HELLP syndrome and DIC working with anaesthetic, medical and haematological colleagues.

Audit of practice has been carried out in all units to which I have been attached and all have had rigorous risk management programmes. I regularly attend perinatal morbidity/mortality and clinical governance meetings, both in gynaecology and obstetrics. I have recently completed a RANZCOG CTG course and attended courses in Obstetric Emergencies and Adult Life Support.

Management

I continue to hone and develop my skills in clinical and risk management through TMA assessed distance learning in Project Management, Leadership and Management and LLM. I have undertaken courses in Appraisal and Root Cause Analysis and completed a course as an Expert Witness. I have previously attended courses in National Health Service Management, Business Management and Law at King's Fund and the Open University and more recently did a short course in Management which is the foundation of the OU MBA Course. My LLM work was undertaken to allow me to improve myself in the areas of clinical risk management and as an expert witness.

I have been responsible for trainee appointments, managed rotas and assessments and developed departmental guidelines. I have organised and attend postgraduate and undergraduate meetings, departmental meetings and meetings for the general public. I

have chaired local colposcopy and cancer MDT meetings and attended Network meetings for both.

I have been responsible for dealing with Quality Assurance matters as lead clinician. This has involved dealing with issues connected with data handling, IT, staffing, timeliness and patient communication and refining local protocols and organising MDTs.

I have been responsible for setting up district colposcopy, obstetric ultrasound and urodynamics services and sat on committees concerned with Oncology delivery, Private Practice and Business Opportunities.

Training and Teaching

I have been involved in Specialist Trainee selection and am a supervisor and assessor for trainees within the RANZCOG Integrated Training Programme and for overseas doctors. I have taken a distance learning course in Postgraduate Medical Education and attended 'Training the Trainers' courses and am IT literate.

I act as mentor and educational supervisor to trainees and undergraduates assigned to me and have helped final year students prepare interactive sex education CD-Roms for teenagers. I teach and lecture undergraduates, postgraduates, midwives, nurses and allied professions.

I consider myself an enthusiastic teacher within the clinical setting taking every opportunity to teach in clinics, on ward rounds and in theatre, seeing this approach as an interesting way to learn. I ensure that SHOs attached to my out-patient clinics are taught by sitting in with me to have their history taking, examination techniques and diagnostic and therapeutic abilities constructively analysed. I am especially keen to teach the importance of problem solving with an evidence-based, individual patient, approach.

I have organised Obstetric and Gynaecological clinical examinations for MB/BS, Conjoint and MRCOG. I have been an examiner for DRCOG. I have carried out OSCE examination for both MB BS and local MRCOG courses and have taught on special skills training courses.

7. Smoking in pregnancy and fetal outcome. Is the number of cigarettes smoked an accurate measure?

Schlesinger P.

Journal of Obstetrics & Gynaecology 1988 Vol 9 No 2 p 162/Victor Bonney Society 1988. I followed over 50 women throughout pregnancy, taking their smoking history and that of their partners. Carboxy-haemoglobin levels were taken serially through pregnancy from the women and once from their partners. I personally scanned the women for anomalies and for growth. Maternal weight gain, placental, fetal and many other parameters were measured and compared to the carboxy-haemoglobin levels.

I showed that there was a significant correlation between cigarettes smoked and the levels, that fetal weight had a linear relationship with maternal weight gain, that fetal outcome and levels were not related but that there was a relationship between placental and fetal weights and that smokers usually compensated for their smoking by increasing placental weight and that those who did not had the smaller babies. More controversially the weight of the baby was only correlated with maternal smoking habit partner, thus refuting the idea, in this study, of 'passive and not that of their was the smoker and not the smoking which was to blame smoking'. I considered that it for poor outcomes.

Having noticed that a number of pill users complained of intermenstrual bleeding, we conducted an audit of such women by using endometrial out patient samples to check for endometrial evidence of ovulation. We also searched hospital records for women with similar 'secretory' endometrium and found more who had been taking the 'pill' regularly at the time of biopsy. We then conducted a literature search for similar papers and found there were none but that two centres had reported biochemical or ultrasound evidence of ovulation in pill takers during the pill free week.
