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Personal Profile

I am a Chartered and Clinical Psychologist, registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC), the British Psychological Society (BPS) and the British Association for Behavioural and Cognitive Psychotherapies (BABCP). I have over 20 years' post-qualification experience, in the medico-legal field, specialising in personal injury, assessing clients for the purpose of writing court reports; in secondary care mental health services in the NHS; and as part of a refuge-based psychological service for women and children escaping domestic violence.

Work Experience

Independent Chartered and Clinical Psychologist, Ann Lewis Ltd, March 2001 to date

I work as a medico-legal expert witness, specialising in personal injury claims. Since 2001, I have assessed around 4000 clients, including adults, teenagers and children. I accept instructions from solicitors, insurance companies and medico-legal agencies, acting for either the Claimant and/or the Defendant, to assess Claimants for conditions such as Posttraumatic Stress Disorder, Adjustment Disorder, anxiety, depression, pain disorders or other psychological injury. I produce high quality and thorough court reports. I am frequently instructed in the following types of cases: road traffic accidents; pedestrian accidents; accidents at work; medical negligence; dental negligence; slips, trips and falls; dog bites; work-related stress; and false arrest/imprisonment by the police. I see clients either face to face or via video link (at present, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, remote instructions are preferred). I am fully aware of my responsibilities as an expert witness and to this end, I have obtained **Part 1 of the Certificate of Medical Reporting: The Bond Solon Civil Procedure Rules Expert Witness Certificate**.

I also offer therapy to private clients, including CBT and third-wave CBT.

I work as a part-time clinical psychologist within this secondary-care NHS team, seeing clients with severe and enduring mental health problems for individual and group therapy. I work mainly within a cognitive behavioural (CBT) framework, especially third wave CBT such as compassion focused therapy and mindfulness. I undertake indirect work with colleagues, including supervision and line management of psychology and non-psychology qualified staff. I have also supervised many clinical and counselling psychology trainees.

Refuge 1997-1999

I set up a psychological service for women and children resident in 3 safe houses. Responsibilities included assessment of difficulties (including impact of abuse) and individual and group interventions (particularly cognitive-behavioural and solution-focused work; also trauma-focused crisis intervention). I collaborated on a large-scale prospective evaluation of the project. I liaised with outside agencies and supervised an Assistant Psychologist and a Community Service Volunteer. <u>Trainee Clinical Psychologist, Camden & Islington NHS Foundation Trust, 1994-1997</u> Responsibilities: assessment and intervention with individuals, families and groups; evaluation of services; teaching/training staff; assisting with consultation.
