## **Clinical Profile**

In addition to general gynaecology, my main interests include assessment and management of primary and complex presentations for women with urinary incontinence and pelvic organ prolapse.

I am proficient in assessment, diagnosis and conservative management of stress urinary incontinence, overactive bladder, voiding dysfunction and all types of pelvic organ prolapse. I am proficient in primary and complex procedures of pelvic floor reconstruction, including colposuspension (open and laparoscopic), bulking agent injections, autologous fascial sling, colpocleisis (partial and total), Manchester repair, uterosacral ligament suspension and abdominal sacrocolpopexy.

I am the Lead Clinician for the Continence Multidisciplinary Team currently covering two Scottish Health Boards, NHS Ayrshire & Arran and NHS Dumfries & Galloway. I am the Director of the Annual Urogynaecology Cadaver Workshops run by London Medical Education Academy.

## **Professional Excellence**

Since 2009, I led the Continence Teams in adopting a patient-centred approach for urogynaecology service. The following is a summary of team achievements in quality improvements:

### **Clinical Assessment:**

- Introduction of validated patient-reported outcome measures (**PROMs**), essential for outcome reporting.
- Introduction of the **Nurse-led Vaginal Pessary Clinic** at the Gynaecology Outpatient Department, serving around 300 patients/year.
- Introduction of the one-stop joint clinic of **Urogynaecology-Urodynamics**. Supervised the learning and helped initiate and support the urogynaecology specialist nurse performing the test for 150 patients/year.

### **Conservative Management:**

• Leading on quality improvement of conservative urogynaecology treatment in Ayrshire. This was achieved by introduction and evaluation of specialised vaginal pessaries (**balloon and continence pessaries**) to treat advanced prolapse in elderly women where ordinary pessaries were not successful. (around 15 patients since May 2010).

- Introduced various continence procedures into local practice:
  - Single-incision mesh tape Bard Ajust
  - **Re-adjustable mesh tape** Neomedic Remeex
  - Colposuspension (Open and Laparoscopic)
- Introduced various prolapse procedures into local practice

- Manchester Repair
- Colpocleisis (partial and total)

### **Outcome Evaluation**

• the National Audit Database (over 600 patient episodes since April 2009 and ongoing). Results of retrospective studies and outcome audits were selected for presentation in various national and international meetings.

## **Research Profile**

Since 2009, I established a research programme assessing various interventions in the field of urogynaecology (female urinary incontinence and pelvic organ prolapse). With a high interest in urogynaecology research, my aim is to put Ayrshire on the national research map of the subspecialty. I was successful in attracting high-profile research activities leading to significant national and international recognition. This has led to the award of a Scottish Government Research Fellowship through the Chief Scientist Office / NHS Research Scotland.

- 5. **PROSPECT: PROIapse Surgery: Pragmatic Evaluation and randomised Controlled Trials.** The study examines the decision to test alternative forms of prolapse surgery (standard fascial repair, repair with biological mesh and repair with Prolene mesh) by means of 2 RCTs within a comprehensive cohort group. 20 patients recruited so far, aiming at 400.
- 6. Development and evaluation of the vaginal symptoms quality of life questionnaire (ICIQ-VSqoI). A multicentre study to validate one of the modular questionnaires under the umbrella of the International Consultation on Incontinence. Five patients recruited so far, aiming at 200 participants.
- 7. Vaginal Hysterectomy in Asymptomatic Uterine Prolapse. The study is designed to answer the question whether or not a concomitant hysterectomy is necessary during anterior vaginal wall repair procedures. Recruitment has completed; 84 participants.

The three-year work involved correlating the Bcl-2 oncogene expression by immunehistochemistry in 60 cervical specimens from patients with different grades of cervical intraepithelial neoplasia (CIN) and invasive cervical cancer. Presented at the Annual Conference of the Ain Shams University Medical School, Cairo, 2001 and accepted for publication in the European Journal of Gynecological Oncology.

# **MSc:** The Role of Biophysical Profile (BPP) in Prediction of Fetal Infection in Patients with Preterm Prelabour Rupture of Membranes (PPROM)

The two-year work involved correlating the biophysical profile score to evidence of fetal/neonatal infection in 60 patients admitted to Ain Shams University Hospital with documented preterm prelabour rupture of membranes. Presented at the Annual Conference of Ain Shams University Medical School, October 1996 and published in the Ain Shams University Medical Journal (not indexed) October, 1998.
