I have completed my required continual professional development and now completed ten annual appraisals the last four on the NHS Toolkit System. I have also kept up a trail of appraisals as a private GP with the Independent Doctors Federation.

MEDICO-LEGAL REPORTS

I have been involved in providing medico-legal reports for personal injuries from 1985 onwards. I had had previous experience at providing all the medico-legal reports for two full-time Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeons at the Royal Hampshire County Hospital in Winchester and continued to provide reports from my practice in Croydon and subsequently in the City. From 1994 to the present day I examine patients in Harley Street.

I have extensive experience in the policies of medico legal assessment and reports. Working from Harley Street on an average of 500 cases a year since 1994. During that time I have been instructed by claimants and defendants. I have attended regular meetings with counsel, provided single expert reports and prepared joint statements with other experts on a number of occasions.

I have had 15 court appearances and given evidence of 7-8 of these occasions. More recently I have worked as a registered member of the MedCo organisation. I have attended training sessions on a regular basis over the last 25 years.

I provide reports on personal injury, soft tissue injury, injuries resulting from road traffic accidents and work related events.

I do not accept cases from criminal cases or matters related to medical negligence.

I have managed a number of assessments remotely over the last 12 months of Covid-19 and due to re-start face to face assessments in April 2021.

INDEPENDENT PRACTICE

I currently work as an independent practitioner and have been a General Practitioner since 1987 following training at Manchester University in 2005, acquiring my Advance Diploma in Occupational Medicine, have worked as an Occupational Practitioner for fifteen years.

I am retired from Medigold in November 2018 just prior to my 71st birthday. I had already planned a retirement from Nuffield Health and I left their service in October of the same year having worked for them for thirteen years.

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH

In 2003 I commenced a two-year Course in Occupational Medicine to gain an AFOM qualification. I then acquired the Advanced Diploma in Occupational Medicine in 2005.

I provide Occupational medical services to many organisations. In August 2005 I started two sessions a week providing Occupational medical reports for the Occupation division of AXA PPP which I continued for a period of twelve months. I have intermittently provided individual medical reports for Health Management Ltd and provided Occupational health services to Hogan Lovells Association newspapers, Telegraph Newspapers and more recently to Medigold Occupational Health service.

I have provided both General Practice and Occupational Health services for Nuffield Health in the City Medical Centre and on site for a number of the firms in the City and West End of London over 30 years.
