

PAUL ANTHONY BASKERVILLE MA DM FRCS

CURRICULUM VITAE

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Paul Baskerville is a Consultant General and Vascular Surgeon in private practice in London.

He qualified from Oxford University and trained at St. Thomas' and St. Bartholomew's Hospitals in London. He has worked in the N.H.S for over thirty years, and was until recently Consultant Vascular Surgeon to King's College, Guy's and St. Thomas' Hospitals. At King's he was Clinical Director of Surgery and Critical Care for many years, and latterly Director of Surgical Practice.

His clinical interests include arterial disease, varicose veins, thrombosis, vibration white finger, groin hernias and day surgery. He has over 60 publications in these fields and has lectured widely including as a visiting Professor in Hong Kong (1997), Sydney (1998), Paris (2003 and 2015) and Oslo (2007). He is currently a lecturer at the Institute of Health Service Management at Keele University where he lectures primarily on Consultant Development and Performance (1995 to date).

Professionally he has examined for the University of London for both the degrees of MBBS and the higher MS Surgical Degree. He was a founder member of the British Association of Day Surgery, and its President from 2000 to 2002. He has sat on the Executive Councils of the International Association of Ambulatory Surgery and the Venous Forum of the Royal Society of Medicine. He is a past prize winner of the Vascular Society of Great Britain and Ireland.

He has served on several NHS committees, including the Modernising Agency for Day Surgery, and as the Elected Vascular Member of the London Clinical Leadership Advisory Group. He was also Chair of the NHS Elect Medical Board.

His Medicolegal work started in 1995 and he has contributed reports in his fields of interest on a regular basis since that time as well as attending Court as an Expert Witness as requested. He now averages over 50 full reports a year, with approximately 75% of these for the claimant.
