I am Suzanne Green. My Occupation is an Equine Veterinary surgeon. I am a director at and an equine Veterinary Surgeon at Greenway Equine Veterinary Services LTD in Lancashire. I qualified from the University of Edinburgh in 2010 with the degree of Bachelor of Veterinary medicine and Surgery (BVM&S) and have been a member of the Royal college of Veterinary Surgeons (MRCVS) since that date. I have been a 100% equine veterinary surgeon since graduation and developed a keen interest in equine welfare work from early on within my career. I completed my master's in veterinary forensic science with the University of Florida in April 2022. I am a member of the Academy of Experts and a member of the International Veterinary Forensic Science Association. I completed my expert witness training in criminal and civil law and have the Cardiff University Bond Solon certificates in 2018.

I am also studying for an Advanced Practitioner certificate in Advanced equine practice in equine dentistry, with the University of Liverpool and am due to complete in March 2024. Special interests include gastroscopy, dentistry, ophthalmology, respiratory conditions and welfare work. I was the veterinary surgeon for the Lancashire Constabulary mounted branch work for 6 years

I was the Veterinary Surgeon in attendance at World Horse Welfare, Penny Farm, from November 2011 to September 2018. I also undertook all the welfare work at the practice and in a wide area across England and Wales. I give lectures at Leahurst (Liverpool Veterinary School) and Surrey University regarding welfare work and frequently provide education to various groups. I am also one of the five official vets at Appleby horse fair since 2016. I am involved with five different area National equine welfare councils (NEWC), which tackle welfare issues of horses across the UK with horse welfare charities.

I am an experienced equine welfare veterinary surgeon and have written many expert reports and attended court on many occasions within this field. I am happy to undertake instruction from both prosecution and defence in this field. I have a sound working knowledge of the Animal Welfare Act 2006 and the Control of horses Act 2015. I have also undertaken Farrier's registration council instruction and local authority instruction. I am happy to act as on single joint expert or single expert basis.

I was the winner of the British Equine Veterinary Association Equine Welfare Award in 2019 and was also awarded the Douglas Houghton Memorial Grant in 2018. In 2021 I was awarded the British Horse Society welfare award. I attended the House of Commons in March 2023 to on a roundtable discussion to discuss the Animal Welfare Act 2006 and its enforcement.
