## Medico-legal Experience

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I have been in medicolegal practice from 2002.

I hold a post-graduate diploma with commendation in Medical Law, and maintain regular medicolegal CPD with attendance in meetings, subscribing to journals and daily updates, and listening to updates from sources such as the EWI. I am the co-editor of the Lower Limb Section for the next edition of Foy and Fagg's Medicolegal Reporting in Orthopaedic Trauma.

I specialise in providing reports on complex and catastrophic injuries.

### **Clinical Experience**

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I have been a full-time Consultant in Orthopaedic Trauma and Limb Reconstruction from 2002. I continue to be in full-time practice in both acute trauma, including major trauma.

My specific area of acute trauma expertise is in treating *multiply injured patients*, complex fractures, open fractures, and the use of *external fixation devices* such as Ilizarov frames and Taylor Spatial Frames.

I carry out *limb lengthening, deformity correction*, and regularly treat *osteomyelitis* in both upper and lower limbs.

I treat complications of fractures such as *nonunion, malunion, Fracture Related Infection, joint stiffness and contractures*.

I have a specialist tertiary practice in reconstruction of *foot and ankle problems after neurological injury*, after complications of diabetes, and in the treatment of *complications after amputation surgery*.

I was previously an Examiner Assessor for the Intercollegiate Board and the International Surgical Board, an Intercollegiate Examiner, Training Programme Director for Orthopaedics, member of the Specialist Advisory Council, and part of Council of the British Limb Reconstruction Society.

### **Terms of Engagement and Timeframes**

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I prefer paperless communication. An email detailing any further records required to complete my report is typically sent within 5 working days after the medicolegal consultation.

My approximate turnaround times are:

**Personal Injury Reports and Condition and Prognosis Reports:** about 42 working days\* from the consultation if all records provided prior to appointment, and about 35 working days\* after receipt of last set of records needed for report.

**Breach of Duty and Causation reports:** about 10 to 12 weeks after receipt of all records

**Supplementary Reports, Correspondence, CPR Part 35 responses:** 30 to 35 working days\* after receipt.
