## **Clinical Experience**

I have been a full-time Consultant in Orthopaedic Trauma and Limb Reconstruction from 2002. I continue to be in full-time practice in both acute trauma, including major trauma.

My specific area of acute trauma expertise is in treating *multiply injured patients*, complex fractures, open fractures, and the use of *external fixation devices* such as Ilizarov frames and Taylor Spatial Frames.

I carry out *limb lengthening, deformity correction*, and regularly treat *osteomyelitis* in both upper and lower limbs.

I treat complications of fractures such as nonunion, malunion, Fracture Related Infection, joint stiffness and contractures.

I have a specialist tertiary practice in reconstruction of *foot and ankle problems after neurological injury*, after complications of diabetes, and in the treatment of *complications after amputation surgery*.

I was previously an intercollegiate examiner, Training Programme Director for Orthopaedics, member of the Specialist Advisory Council, and part of Council of the British Limb Reconstruction Society. I was an Examiner Assessor for the Intercollegiate Board and International Surgical Board until 2025.
