CLINICAL, LEADERSHIP & RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Although working outside a formal academic setting I have consistently developed, lead, undertaken and published a wide range of research in a number of areas including forensic medicine and science, clinical nutrition and gastroenterology since the mid 1980s. My current **research interests** are predominantly related to healthcare in custody, death investigation, restraint techniques, including Taser® and irritant spray, excited delirium, evidential sampling, restraint deaths, death and harm in custody, spithoods, hospital referrals, complaints against healthcare professionals, Medical Examiner roles, stalking in forensic medicine and the quality of recording and imaging of injuries. I have particular interests in the disproportionate application of use of force techniques on specific groups and vulnerable individuals. I am Chair of the **UK Scientific Advisory Committee on the Medical Implications of Less-Lethal Weapons**.

I have a broad-based clinical background embracing clinical and research work in a wide range of specialties. I am an active clinician and for 30 + years have seen up to 1500-2000 patients per annum in a variety of settings, generally custodial. I assessed > 70,000 patients within custodial settings as a **Forensic Medical Examiner** (forensic physician) for the Metropolitan Police Service jurisdiction in London, UK from ~ 1990- 2021.

I have worked with a wide variety of colleagues and have been medical lead for **research studies** with organisations such as the Metropolitan Police Service and the Independent Office of Police Conduct (formerly the Independent Police Complaints Commission).

My research group has undertaken and continues to undertake national Freedom of Information studies on police custodial healthcare services, complaints against healthcare professionals, use of force and use of imaging in the forensic setting. We are currently undertaking a study on stalking in forensic medicine.

I have been continuously involved in teaching and education in a number of settings.

I was appointed **Honorary Clinical Professor – William Harvey Institute, Queen Mary University of London in 2018**. This continued on a role as Honorary Senior Lecturer at Cameron Forensic Medical Sciences (based at the William Harvey Institute) in which I had been in post since 2006. In this setting I have been responsible for the majority of Clinical Forensic Medicine teaching on subjects such as Acute Behavioural Disturbance and Mental Health Issues, Introduction to Clinical Forensic Medicine, Forensic Assessment of Complainants & Suspects of Sexual Assault, Injury Documentation and Interpretation, Torture & Cruel, Inhuman & Degrading Treatment. Over this period I have supervised several dozen MSc dissertations for students on the **MSc in Forensic Medical Sciences** course and similarly supervised, advised and mentored substantial amounts of other work for pre- and post-graduate students of Queen Mary University of London, such as those on SSC and clinical forensic medicine modules. I am author of one of the modules for the **MSc in Violence Reduction and the Safer Management of Persons in Care or Custody**.

I am frequently asked to investigate **circumstances of death**. This may be in a variety of settings including the hospital and community, in places of detention both in the UK and overseas. I work closely on such cases with forensic pathologists, forensic scientists and others, and may be instructed by law-enforcement organisations, families, coroners and regulatory bodies. I have particular interests in **miscarriages of justice** and have reviewed a variety of cases where forensic science or medical issues have been challenged in the UK and overseas.

I was **President of the Faculty of Forensic & Legal Medicine** (from 2015-2017) of the Royal College of Physicians, and, with colleagues initiated and prepared a bid for recognition of Forensic & Legal Medicine as a defined medical specialty. That process is currently underway. During my Presidency the Faculty was accepted as full member of the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges and established a Specialty Advisory Committee on Forensic & Legal Medicine at the JRCPTB. I developed a strategy of consensus working, building strong links with relevant bodies including other medical faculties and Colleges, and organisations, bodies or individuals such as the Chartered Society of Forensic Sciences, the Forensic Science Regulator, the Home Office and Her Majesty's Inspectorates. I was also **President of the World Police Medical Officers** from 2011-2014.

I was **Editor-in-Chief** of the Journal of Forensic & Legal Medicine for > 20 years and subsequently Consultant Editor-in-Chief until December 2019. I initiated and led its development as a peer-reviewed, significant international journal of forensic medicine and science.

I have worked closely with the Forensic Science Regulator to raise standards in forensic medicine and forensic science. I have undertaken hundreds of physical examinations of individuals making allegations of previous **torture, cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment**, in the context of non-recent and more recent complaints. These have been interpreted according to the Manual on the Effective Investigation and Documentation of Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment (the 'Istanbul Protocol'), a subject on which I have taught in lectures and workshops in the UK and abroad. I have contributed to, and provided all body diagrams for the **2nd edition of the Istanbul Protocol** which is published in June 2022. I am a **Member of the International Forensic Expert Group** of the International Rehabilitation Council for Victims of torture

I have provided evidence to the Baha Mousa, Al-Sweady and Sheku Bayoh Public Inquiries in the UK.

I was appointed **Lead Medical Examiner** to the Norfolk & Norwich University Hospital NHS Trust in 2019 and have led the establishment of a Medical Examiner Service to review all hospital and community deaths, working closely with mortuary, bereavement and morbidity and mortality teams (amongst others), and externally HM Coroner and Registration office. The Medical Examiner role was established by the Coroners & Justice Act 2009. The Medical Examiner Service which I lead reviews approximately 3000 deaths per annum. I led this Service throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and have managed the increased workload related to COVID-19 deaths. The Service has reviewed ~15000 deaths to date. I have initiated and co-edited the first textbook on the **Medical Examiner Service in England & Wales** which was published in October 2022, and we have an ongoing research program about our role.

I established a **Forensic Medical Examiner quarterly audit meeting** in 2011 which ran for 10 years in London. This acted as a focus for clinical practitioners from across London, and welcomed diverse speakers from a range of backgrounds including science and the law.

I have given expert opinion for a wide variety of bodies overseas and have given live evidence or produced written reports for a variety of jurisdictions and courts including Kenya, Ireland, Scotland, Spain, Malta Channel Islands, Hong Kong, Mexico, Eire, New Zealand, Gibraltar, India, USA and the Turks and Caicos Islands.

AREAS of WORK

My work generally embraces some or all of clinical, research, writing, teaching and court attendance.

Forensic & Medicolegal

I am currently one of five General Medical Council recognised specialists in forensic & legal medicine in the UK. I am a forensic physician and was a Senior Forensic Medical Examiner to the Metropolitan Police Service and City of London Police between 1990-2008. I remain clinically active as a forensic physician with the Metropolitan Police Service and as a consultant to assorted bodies. In this role I have been responsible for the general medical care and forensic assessment of adult and child detainees in police custody, which included suspects of crime and the assessment of restraint and use of force injuries such as those from police batons, handcuffs, irritant sprays, Tasers and Excited Delirium Syndrome. I see adult and child complainants of crime. I undertake the medical care and forensic assessment of complainants of crime and those detained under terrorist legislation. This work has elements of both primary care, mental health and forensic assessment. I have assessed many adult and child victims of alleged torture and am familiar with and teach on aspects of the Istanbul and Minnesota Protocols.

Clinical forensic medicine requires knowledge within the areas of alcohol and drug misuse, effects of restraint, mental health law, assault and injury (including assessment, diagnosis, treatment and prognosis), pathology of injury, occupational health, child abuse and sexual assault.

I am instructed and appear in court regularly as an expert witness for prosecution or defence in most of these areas. I have been involved in reviews of a number of cases of death in police and prison custody for (amongst others), the IOPC, the Prison & Probation Ombudsman, & the Prison Ombudsman of Northern Ireland. Such work may involve physical examination, photographic examination, review of evidence (eg video, DVD, CD, Body Worn Video) and production of full reports incorporating such material.

I am external Consultant to the National Injuries Database and the National Crime Agency.

I appear regularly in court at all levels – from magistrates court to the Court of Appeal. I appear in courts across England, Wales and Scotland and other international jurisdictions. I was Lead & Specialist Assessor for the Council for the Registration of Forensic Practitioners until its dissolution in March 2009.

I have been closely involved in research that has studied complaints against healthcare professionals, mental health, alcohol misuse, drug misuse, mental health, HIV prevalence, violence and treatment of individuals in police custody – including near misses and deaths in custody (with the Independent Police Complaints Commission), police assault and restraint injuries. I submit research work to relevant meetings nationally and around the world. I frequently work, teach and educate doctors, healthcare personnel and others on a worldwide basis. I have been responsible at various times for the medical training in deaths and care in custody to all new custody officers working within the Metropolitan Police Service and continue to teach on aspects of healthcare of detainees.

I have a specific interest in near-misses and deaths in custody and have reviewed, from a medical point of view, many deaths and serious incidents in police or prison custody and numerous near-miss incidents. Reviews have been on behalf of a number of agencies including the IPCC, PPO, coroners, police forces and families. I have been involved in the review of a number of miscarriages of justice in the UK and overseas.

I was closely involved in the establishment and development of the Faculty of Forensic & Legal Medicine of the Royal College of Physicians. I was elected to serve as the first Vice-President (Forensic Medicine). I was President from 2015-2017.

I was elected as President of the World Police Medical Officers in 2011 until 2014, and following a successful meeting in 2014 have been responsible with my successor of replacing this with the International Association of Clinical Forensic Medicine, which had its inaugural meeting at the 2018 International Association of Forensic Sciences in Toronto.

Clinical Nutrition

I was Nutrition Team Leader at the Central Middlesex Hospital between 1986 and 1990 where I developed my clinical and research interests in all aspects of clinical nutrition. I have undertaken research in substrates, delivery and metabolism of enteral and parenteral nutrition. I have been involved in teaching and education at national and international level in parenteral, enteral and home nutrition. I have published widely in these fields. I was founder and co-editor of the secondary reference journal – Current Medical Literature – Clinical Nutrition.

As external medical consultant to a number of organisations my responsibilities have included staff education/training, production of clinical expert reports, regulatory process, assessment of research projects, strategic advice and medical advice. My role involved teaching, education to both company personnel and to healthcare professionals in Europe, America and Asia. I still have particular interests in raising awareness of the need for nutrition support and delivery of such therapies.

Gastroenterology

I have undertaken diagnostic endoscopy and gastroenterology consultations. I spent 4 years full time as a clinical Research Fellow at the Department of Gastroenterology and Nutrition at the Central Middlesex Hospital between 1986 and 1990. I hold the EC Specialist Certificate in Gastroenterology.

I was founding director of Greenwich Medical Media Ltd, a publishing company specialising in medical and healthcare subjects. Techniques & Devices

Palliation of Malignant Dysphagia

This is a technique described by myself and colleagues for the palliation of malignant dysphagia secondary to neoplasms of the stomach and oesophagus (Ethanol-induced Tumour Necrosis - ETN). It is of particular use in patients with inoperable and/or irresectable tumours and those patients with tumour recurrence at anastomosis following surgery, and it appears to be as good as laserpalliation.

Grasping Forceps

I designed and developed endoscopic forceps for tube and foreign body manipulation which are in commercial production (CMH Graspers - Georg Pauldrach).

Post-operative Gastric Aspiration/Feeding Tube

I designed and developed a double-lumen post-operative tube which allows simultaneous gastric aspiration and intraduodenal/jejunal administration of feed. (Corpak USA).

Percutaneous endoscopic gastrostomy/jejunostomy tube

In conjunction with clinicians in the USA I developed a jejunostomy conversion of a PEG (Bower PEJ - Corpak USA)

ForensiGraph® & ForensiBag® & OOHBag® & ForensiDoc®

I have developed a range of colour scales for use in the forensic setting to allow size and colour comparison. The ForensiGraph is now widely used in forensic settings. With Cathy Cooke I have developed a single-use bag for the administration of single medication doses in secure settings and for out of hours services. ForensiDoc® is an App designed for immediate healthcare assessment and evidence collection.
