Career Summary

I have examined in excess of 1000 cases from private and corporate instructions, civil and criminal matters as instructed by legal advisors, including cases where I have acted as a Single Joint Expert, government departments and direct instruction from various UK Police forces. I have also provided evidence for enquiries into media personalities and politicians, including magisterial inquiries in Malta.

I have given expert evidence at court on many occasions, attending magistrates, crown and county courts all over the UK in person and providing evidence remotely in the UK and abroad. I have also given evidence remotely on several occasions at the Royal Courts of Justice in London and the Coroner's Court in the Cayman Islands.
