

### **PROFILE**

A British citizen who provides consultancy and training in public safety, security, and crisis management through his UK-registered company, OTHO Ltd, which he established in 2011.

He developed OTHO as a successful business using his personal experiences in various disaster management roles in the Royal Air Force, British Transport Police, Civil Service and British Red Cross. This has led to OTHO receiving awards that are listed on page five of this document.

Service as a superintendent with the British Transport Police and as a member of the UK Police Major Disaster Advisory Team included attendance at many of Britain's major rail incidents, notably Clapham Junction (1988), Severn Tunnel (1991), Cowden (1994), Ladbroke Grove (1999), Hatfield (2000), Great Heck (Selby) 2001 and Potters Bar (2002). In addition to his UK rail experiences he has responded to overseas disasters whilst working for the British Red Cross and other UK emergencies such as major flooding and the 2005 London Bombings.

With OTHO, he has completed a design project as part of an international consortium of companies developing an early warning system (EWS) for the Government of Peru. The EWS is one of a series of major reconstruction projects initiated through a Government-to-Government agreement between Peru and the UK and aims to provide populations along the Peruvian coastline with early notification of major flooding and landslides so that they can evacuate to places of safety. OTHO's role was to design evacuation routes, signage, training and raise public awareness of these new public safety arrangements that will save lives.

More recently, he has completed a strategic security report and a security risk and threat analysis report for a new high-speed rail line in the Middle East.

He acts as an advocate for Armed Forces veterans who appeal to First-tier Tribunals for variations in their compensation awards under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme and War Pensions Scheme.

He is currently representing an individual in his application to the Criminal Cases Review Commission for his conviction for murder to be referred to the Court of Appeal (Criminal Division). This followed him conducting a lengthy case review. The man remains in prison following his arrest in 1988 and conviction in 1989.
