For 12 years, he has dedicated himself almost exclusively to police custody, delivering forensic healthcare. Including nine years as an independent non-medical prescriber, he holds two MSc degrees in advanced forensic and clinical practice.

Matthew is a recognised leader in forensic healthcare, playing a pivotal role in inducting and ongoing training custody healthcare professionals. He has a long history of assessing individuals detained under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984. His contributions to the field are well-documented, with extensive publications in peer-reviewed literature and co-editing the first book for healthcare professionals on this subject.

His legal acumen is well established, and he has 12 years of experience writing court reports and providing evidence across magistrates, crown, and coroner courts. In 2022, he was seconded to NHS England as part of Dame Ruth May's Chief Nursing Officer's Clinical Nurse Fellowship programme.

Matthew serves as a clinical leader and role model for custody healthcare professionals. His responsibilities include leading the induction, teaching, training, and supervision of clinical staff. Matthew has been instrumental in the development of guidelines, policies, and patient group directions. Matthew continues to see patients undertaking the depth and breadth of police healthcare referrals and complex case referrals from colleagues, including the assessment of individuals who have been tasered. Additionally, he mentors, supports, and trains staff undertaking post-registration clinical modules, including on competencies in prescribing, minor illness management, and advanced physical examination skills. He is often required to prepare statements for the courts or give evidence, including at magistrates, crown, and coroner's courts.

The role involves assessing fitness to detain, interview, and release, making recommendations on caring for individuals in custody, recommending levels of observation, and identifying the need for an appropriate adult. Undertaking samples under the Road Traffic Act 1988 and forensic samples (including non-intimate and intimate samples) from suspects involved in serious offences under the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984.
