In my currant post I provide tertiary level, specialised Foot and Ankle service for Lothian at Edinburgh Royal Infirmary and St John's Hospital Livingston.

My practice covers the entire spectrum of adult Foot and Ankle surgery and limb reconstruction.

(II) Trauma:

• Trauma surgery was always an integral part of my orthopaedic training. I worked and trained in one of the busiest trauma centres in Egypt (Ain Shams University) and two of the best trauma centres in the UK (Edinburgh Royal Infirmary and Queens Medical Centre Nottingham). This allowed me to be confident with any major or complex

trauma case, including paediatric trauma, complex peri-articular fractures, hand and foot injuries, and hind foot and Os Calcis trauma.

- I have also developed a special interest in Limb reconstruction and Management of post-trauma complications. Having worked at 2 major limb reconstruction centres (Ain Shams University and Edinburgh Royal Infirmary) and finished an <u>advanced Ilizarov and limb reconstruction fellowship</u> in Liverpool, I gained a wide experience in the Ilizarov technique. I became confident with clinical assessment, decision making, frame constructions, patients' follow up, postoperative frame adjustments and evaluation of the outcome of Ilizarov surgeries.
- I am currently working independently with the full spectrum of limb lengthening and reconstruction implants including the <u>Ilizarov frame</u> and the <u>Taylor Spatial Frame</u>.

(III) Subspecialty Interest:

• Foot and Ankle Surgery:

I developed this special interest over the years of my training. I successfully finished a PhD thesis on "Correction of Complex Foot & Ankle Deformities in Adults", which allowed me to expand my knowledge in Foot and Ankle biomechanics, the gait cycle, the different pathologies that may affect this area and the different treatment modalities. I was extensively involved in the surgical management of complex post-traumatic and neuromuscular deformities, neglected and recurrent congenital cases, post-burn contractures and rheumatoid foot and ankle pathologies.

In my current post, I manage the full spectrum of Foot and Ankle pathologies, including <u>forefoot reconstruction</u> as Scarf and Akin osteotomies, Lapidus procedure, 1st MTPJ fusion and replacement, toe deformity corrections, Weil osteotomy, Morton neuroma excision, as well as <u>Ankle, Hind & Midfoot reconstruction</u> as subtalar and triple fusions, calcaneal osteotomies, tibialis posterior reconstruction, calcaneoplasty, planter fascia surgery, ankle fusion, ankle arthroscopy and replacement, and ankle instability surgery. I also manage the <u>rheumatoid foot</u>, and I master the use of <u>circular frames</u> for complex foot deformities.

I have a major interest in Total Ankle replacement, Ankle Arthritis in young patients, Complex ankle sports injuries and reconstruction of cartilage defect in the ankle joint.
