Hazel Peet is an experienced and highly trained Registered General Nurse with over 17 years of NHS experience, including more than 13 years in senior clinical leadership roles. She specialises in gastroenterology, hepatology, urgent and primary care, and has developed extensive expertise in the management alcohol-use disorders (AuD).

Hazel holds a Master's degree in Advanced Clinical Practice with Distinction and is a qualified Non-Medical Prescriber with a broad prescribing scope, including controlled drugs and IV treatments. As an Advanced Clinical Practitioner, she is fully trained to assess, diagnose, treat, and discharge patients with undifferentiated and complex health needs, mirroring the clinical capacity of a medical doctor.

She was formerly Lead Nurse for the Acute Alcohol Service at the UK's largest NHS Trust and authored the Trust's guidelines for management of alcohol-use disorders, now adopted nationally. Her previous roles also include Advanced Clinical Practitioner within a Community Crisis Team and Service Lead for the Urgent Treatment Centre at Stepping Hill Hospital. She also played an integral part in the development of an ACP led rapid-access and diagnostics service
